**Family Service at Overy 14th July at 11.15**

Each month from now on, there will be a service in one of our churches for young families, parents, children and grandparents and the first of these will be on Sunday the 14th July at the special time of 11.15 - so you do not have to get up too early! There will be a variety of music, some craft activities and storytelling for all as we explore different themes for different seasons. This month we shall celebrate the coming holidays, wonder about refreshment and recreation and join in making something to take with us. This service is open to everyone and is simple and specially designed for those who are not familiar with church tradition but also has something for those who are.

**After Sail Service : 7th July**

**Burnham Overy Boathouse an hour and a half after high tide (12.07)**

Well, the tide for sailing at Burnham Overy is approximately two hours before high tide and two hours after so from **12.00** on July 7th (high tide is at 10.37) we will be in the boathouse with coffee, tea, other refreshments and the Sunday papers to talk over these things. It is *informal* just drop in when derigged to pick out news items and talk them over from a religious perspective.

**New service times for the midmorning services is 10.00**
